Legendary guitarist **Bill Frisell** returns to Melbourne for the Opening Night of the 2017 Festival.

Hailed as "the most innovative and influential jazz guitarist of the past 25 years" (Wall Street Journal), Frisell's 35-year career has seen collaborations with the likes of Elvis Costello, Bono and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. Bold and inventive, Frisell has turned his hand to avant-garde, noise, folk music and more, yet always remaining true to his roots in jazz.

Frisell's acclaimed new project features unique interpretations of classic American cinema music, ranging from Hitchcock's *Psycho* through to Ennio Morricone's *Once Upon a Time in the West*, via Nino Rota's iconic score for *The Godfather*.

After years of composing for other artists, Bley's recording of her 1971 jazz-rock opera *Escalator Over the Hill* announced a unique and powerful voice. Since then, she has produced a remarkable body of work across almost 30 albums, in small groups and big bands, most notably with Charlie Haden's Liberation Music Orchestra. In 2015 she was recognised with the NEA Jazz Master award – the highest honour an American jazz artist can receive.

Her chamber trio with **Steve Swallow** (Gary Burton, John Scofield) and **Andy Sheppard** (Gil Evans, Randy Brecker) displays the sophisticated interaction and inspiring intimacy that comes from 20 years of collaboration. Imagine listening with your eyes and using your heart, your hands and your instinct to voice your emotions. Imagine music transformed into physicality, where the wildness and passion of bodies moving matches the rawness of explosive live drumming.

KAGE's latest work, featuring profoundly Deaf dancer Anna Seymour and percussionist Myele Manzanza, explores the power of non-verbal language, intense physical prowess and the role that sound plays within communication.
