The Cat Empire's founding firebrand trumpet-playing vocalist **Harry James Angus** collaborates with drummer **Freyja Hooper** in a duo whose sound is marked by hypnotic rhythms and complete harmonic freedom.

Al Di Meola sits firmly among the greatest guitarists of our time, with a celebrated international career spanning almost five decades and numerous prestigious awards under his belt.

A bona fide guitar luminary and prolific composer, Di Meola has amassed over 20 albums as a leader while collaborating on many more with the likes of fusion supergroup Return to Forever (with the late Chick Corea, Stanley Clarke and Lenny White) and the celebrated acoustic Guitar Trio featuring fellow virtuosos John McLaughlin and Paco de Lucia.

A pioneer of blending jazz with musical styles from around the world, Di Meola's dazzling technique on both acoustic and electric guitars has afforded him regal status among the hordes of fretboard fanatics who regularly flock to his concerts, while the depth of his writing along with the soulfulness and inherent lyricism of his musical expression have won him legions of fans worldwide beyond the guitar aficionado set.

Dan TepferNatural Machines

In an age of unprecedented technological advancement, **Dan Tepfer** is changing the definition of what a musical instrument can be.

As a pianist and collaborator, Tepfer has performed alongside legends of the international jazz scene including Pharoah Sanders and Lee Konitz. Returning to MIJF after more than a decade, Tepfer will showcase his pioneering skill in this truly unique Festival experience by programming a Yamaha Disklavier to respond in real time to the music he improvises at the piano. Meanwhile, another computer program turns the music into stunning animated visual art projected onto the domed ceiling of the Melbourne Planetarium.

Called "fascinating and ingenious" by Rolling Stone, the Natural Machines performance lives at a unique intersection of mechanical and natural processes, making it more than solo piano, but rather a "piece of contemporary art so well made and expressed by such a thoughtful, talented, evocative pianist... that it becomes a complete experience". 





Flora Carbo

Take Note is MIJF's annual artist development and gender equity initiative. Now in its fourth year, the program champions diversity, celebrates women and gender diverse leaders on stage, and encourages school-aged musicians across Victoria to consider a career in jazz performance.

Each year, MIJF selects an outstanding early-mid career musician to lead the program—providing a cash bursary to develop a new work to premiere at the annual Festival, alongside a tailored career development package. Ahead of the Festival, the appointed Jazz Leader also undertakes a tour of regional and metropolitan Victorian high schools, leading interactive workshops and masterclasses for the next generation of aspiring jazz musicians and modelling diverse leadership in jazz and improvised music.

MIJF's 2022 Jazz Leader is Naarm-based saxophonist Flora Carbo—one of the most exciting young artists in Australian jazz. Flora is a three-time nominee for the Freedman Jazz Fellowship (2018, 2019 and 2021), a finalist for Young Australian Jazz Artist of the Year in the 2019 Australian Jazz Bell Awards, and winner of the prestigious James Morrison Scholarship at the Generations of Jazz Festival in 2017. She performs regularly alongside some of the biggest names in Australian jazz including Andrea Keller and Barney McAll, and coleads groups including The Rest is Silence and AAALTO.

The program provides a cash bursary to support the development of a new work to premiere at the annual Melbourne International Jazz Festival; an additional bursary for artistic and professional development opportunities; and participation in the AAO's Creative Music Intensive, a 10-day annual residency held in Tarraleah, Tasmania.

In 2022, the First Nations Resident Artist is composer and Yuin woman Brenda Gifford. A classically trained pianist and saxophonist, Brenda's work and arts practice is informed by her Country, community and culture. Brenda creates contemporary classical music for ensembles, orchestras, choirs, dance and theatre, and festivals. Currently studying a Master of Music (Composition) in the Composing Women program at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, Brenda has had work commissioned and performed by the Canberra, Tasmania and Sydney Symphony Orchestras, as well as ABC Jazz, Ensemble Offspring, Sydney Chamber Orchestra, Australian Art Orchestra and Sydney Dance Company.


