



Cécile McLorin Salvant

A charismatic storyteller and dramatically charged performer, Salvant combines searingly emotive vocals with a captivating stage presence in a thrilling force that has electrified audiences the world over, and reimagined jazz for a new generation.

As the most accomplished jazz vocalist of her generation, Salvant has collected countless accolades, winning the Thelonious Monk competition in 2010, receiving the MacArthur fellowship in 2022 and the Duke Artist Award—as well as the GRAMMY Award for Best Jazz Vocal Album for three consecutive years.

Seamlessly traversing genre and culture—from jazz, blues, baroque and folkloric music—Salvant will take audiences on a mesmeric journey through a broad repertoire ranging from rich interpretations of familiar songs to rarely performed treasures—all brought to life with a uniquely theatrical flair.

GoGo Penguin

— UK

In what is sure to be sweet news for long-time fans, UK instrumental trio **GoGo Penguin** will make their long-awaited maiden voyage to Australia for an electrifying performance that is guaranteed to thrill audiences and convert even the staunchest jazz non-believer.

The cinematic break-beat trio have garnered a cult-like following for their rare combination of dance-friendly production, anthemic melodies and virtuosic jazz instrumentation. Fusing jazz, classical and electronic influences (amongst others) with a thirst for innovation, they've enjoyed success matched by precious few instrumental groups post-millennium.

GoGo Penguin's music has always defied categorisation. In their sound, there have been detectable traces of latter-day developments in jazz, such as Sweden's free-thinking Esbjörn Svensson Trio (EST), or minimalist classical composers like Steve Reich, John Adams, even Erik Satie. Yet, all in their mid-30s, you can hear that they have grown up in the golden age of electronica, with echoes ranging from the rarefied styles of Aphex Twin and Massive Attack through to Roni Size's jazz-infused drum 'n' bass.

Nduduzo Makhathini

— South Africa

The first South African musician to be signed to Blue Note Records and a long-time collaborator with Shabaka Hutchings, pianist and composer **Nduduzo Makhathini** has carved a unique space for himself in the global jazz scene.

Growing up in the lush and rugged hillscapes of uMgungundlovu, Makhathini draws influence from the ancient culture of the Zulu, in which music and ritual practices are symbiotically linked. Also carrying influences from John Coltrane and McCoy Tyner as well as the legends of South African jazz, it is the convergence of these musical and cultural traditions that creates such a unique power in his music.

Considered a 'musical philosopher' by his peers, the prolific recording artist has brought a bold new energy to the genre. His eleventh, and most recent album *In the Spirit of Ntu* has been described as a 'prayer,' and indeed feels imprinted with cosmic purpose, while his previous Blue Note release was named one of the 'Best Jazz Albums of 2020' by *The New York Times*.

Making his Australian debut over two incredible nights at The JazzLab, Makhathini will perform with his trio featuring Zwelakhe-Duma Bell le Pere and Francisco Mela, in the final concerts of the 2023 festival. William Barton & Nduduzo Makhathini

— Australia / South Africa

In a very special MIJF collaboration, formidable Blue Note pianist, Nduduzo Makhathini (South Africa), will be joined by distinguished ARIA winner, 2023 Queensland Australian of the Year and Kalkadunga man, William Barton—whose peerless profile as a composer, vocalist and didgeridoo player has awarded him the title of the world's pre-eminent didgeridoo musician.

Fusing jazz improv with the rhythmic swagger of hip-hop, celebrated drummer, composer and self-proclaimed "beat scientist" **Makaya McCraven** pushes jazz into thrillingly uncharted territory.

With a gift for collapsing space, destroying borders and blending past, present, and future into poly-textural arrangements of post-genre jazz-rooted music, McCraven is truly at the vanguard of modern jazz. Met with universal acclaim, his 2022 album *In These Times* featured in countless Album of the Year roundups, including Stereogum and NPR.

As a child of the nineties, hip-hop had an inescapable influence on the Chicago-based artist, whose dexterous approach has drawn comparison with the likes of the late J Dilla—while a recent collaboration with New York post-punk outfit Interpol gives an insight into McCraven's versatility and broad appeal.

But it's his ability to nimbly meld the visceral energy of hip-hop beats with the methodical precision of classic jazz—and then elevate the two into new realms—that makes him such a standalone performer. 





Take Note

Cheryl Durongpisitkul

Take Note is MIJF's annual artist development and gender equity initiative. Now in its fifth year, the program champions diversity, celebrates women and gender diverse leaders on stage, and encourages school-aged musicians across Victoria to consider a career in jazz performance.

Each year, MIJF selects an outstanding early-mid career musician to lead the program—providing a cash bursary to develop a new work to premiere at the annual festival, alongside a tailored career development package. Ahead of the festival, the appointed Jazz Leader also undertakes a tour of regional and metropolitan Victorian high schools, leading interactive workshops and masterclasses for the next generation of aspiring jazz musicians and modelling diverse leadership in jazz and improvised music.

MIJF's 2023 Jazz Leader is composer and saxophonist **Cheryl Durongpisitku**. Known for her innovative style and ability to weave captivating narratives through her work, Cheryl received the SIMA Young Composer Award in 2019 and was nominated for the Freedman Jazz Fellowship in 2020. She co-leads the JazzLab Orchestra and has released two albums, *Menagerie* (2018) and *Pink Milk* (2021) with collaborative trio Koi Kingdom.

First Nations Artist Residency Program Bumpy

Presented in partnership with the Australian Art Orchestra (AAO), MIJF's First Nations Artist Residency Program is an artistic and professional development initiative that supports a First Nations musician with a practice in jazz, improvisation or contemporary art music and its composition.

The program provides a cash bursary to support the development of a new work to premiere at the Melbourne International Jazz Festival; an additional bursary for artistic and professional development opportunities; and participation in the AAO's Creative Music Intensive.

In 2023, the First Nations Resident Artist is award-winning Noongar woman and Naarm-based artist **Bumpy**. Bumpy's captivating live performances have enthralled audiences nationwide, having graced the stages of renowned festivals and events such as BIGSOUND, Strawberry Fields, Boogie Festival, Melbourne Music Week, Queenscliff Music Festival, and more. 2022 saw Bumpy win the Triple J Unearthed NIMAs Competition, feature as a Triple J Spotlight Artist and win the Uncle Archie Roach Foundation Award at the Music Victoria Awards. Bumpy's MIJF commission will premiere in the 2024 festival. Stay tuned for updates.

MIJF International Engagement Program

As a major presenter of jazz and improvised music in Australia, MIJF aims to provide a context for interconnectivity and linked engagement between the domestic and international industry. The MIJF International Engagement Program supports both inbound and outbound industry engagement by inviting major presenters, agents, label representatives and press to Australia, as well as showcasing the very best of Australian jazz at major international festivals abroad. In 2023 our International Showcase Series will include presenting a selection of talented Australian artists at the London Jazz Festival, and facilitating connections with the European market on behalf of Australian artists. 
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

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
